3. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING HELD FRIDAY 16th October 2019
Minutes were accepted as true, and signed by the Chair, Eira Lewis.
4. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES
 - Speed Activated Signs
David Robinson produced literature from Morelock signs working in Baschurch Parish Council Shropshire with a price list dated 3/10/19 cost £3105.60 for the MSID vario radar Mounting poles and 2yr guarantee Vat was £517.60 .The signs illuminate with the speed and either inform you to slow down in red or thank you in green. An E mail from the Parish council which comments that the average speeds of drivers has reduced substantially and that the signs record traffic speeds and statistics .Which can then be used further enforcement.
Council had the opportunity to look at the Information from Morelock, and were keen to purchase. But will use the opportunity from Denbighshire County council to use their sign in November, Council has had the policy for this use explained and each

has a copy. This device records speeds and can be downloaded and examined which would give an overview on speeds of vehicles

Old School Project

David Robinson, as agreed by the council meeting 6/9/19 would seek legal advice re the lease agreement for the Old School. He has done so and as a result suggests a 21 year lease laid out in a Memorandum of Understanding Agreement between DCC and Llandrillo Community Council, this would say what the lease means, so there was no liability to LCC. That any bills for this were the issue for the steering group, they have £2000 in funds. This Memorandum is now with DCC. (Mr Robinson supplied a copy of the meaning of a Memorandum of understanding)

Education in Llandrillo

Councillor White outlined the case of the closure of Llandrillo School /the promises that were made at the time in relation to nursery education in Llandrillo/numbers of pupils at present/predicted /teaching conditions, class sizes at Bro Dyfrdwy and a contact with local AM and a petition for bringing Education back to Llandrillo . She states at Bro Dyfrdwy there are 130 including nursery, this should be 110 . That the capacity for intake of pupils per year was 15 but with the projected figures this would be 25 and she could not see the numbers going down. That there would not be enough spaces for Welsh medium of education. She comments that at present some local schools are to capacity. In the Llandrillo area are 49 children of school age, 11 0 to 3 year olds and 5 babies due . That a petition to reopen the school she has 700 names, she has been in contact with the AM who has contacted Kirsty Williams Minister for education in Wales

Councillor Mabon stated that the school's capacity is 115 but it should be 134

Discussed extension of Bro Dyfrdwy in his opinion would not happen as DCC are not keen on going up and they cannot extend out due to the size of the playground per pupil .

Future house building in Llandrillo (10) and Cynwyd(24) was discussed

Re opening the school discussed Councillor Lloyd suggested it needed the backing of the village Mabon warned about wording raising the expectations of people in the village He went on to say that re opening of the school in Llandrillo would lead to other schools in Wales requesting the same .

The approach to take would be to bring back Education to Llandrillo community or a site for Bro Dyfrdwy within Llandrillo. This would meet the aim of accessible education .

Llandrillo Community Council support the position of bringing education back to Llandrillo and would put this in writing to be handed in with the petition at the next big County Council meeting .
