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**Draft Minutes of the Llandrillo CC Ordinary Council Meeting
held on Tuesday 26th July 2022**

The meeting commenced at 7:35 pm

Present: Councillors Becky Mollison-White (Chair), David Robinson (Vice Chair), Delyth Jones, Lawrence Jones, Bryn Roberts, Dafydd Phillips, David Williams and Rhys Roberts.

The Clerk and RFO, Siân E Thomas, was also present as was 1 member of the public and DCC Councillor Alan Hughes, Corwen.

225. Councillor Becky Mollison-White welcomed everyone to the meeting.

226. Apologies were received from DCC Councillor Gwyneth Ellis.

227. Declarations of Interest: The Chair asked for any Declarations Interest, David Williams expressed a personal interest in the Gaerwen Windfarm item.

228. Public Participation Session.

Concern was expressed over speeding vehicles in the village as young children have to walk on a road with no pavement to get to the playground. It was also mentioned that the Llandrillo village sign has disappeared. **Action:** Clerk to contact DCC about replacing the missing sign. Clerk to also contact DCC regarding advice to see if anything can be done regarding the speeding concerns, and to contact Denbigh police station as the police officer there is aware of the issue. It was noted that the bench outside the Ganolfan needs repairing and that a quote is being obtained for its repair.

229. Minutes of the Meeting held on the 28th June 2022. Council, having considered the Minutes, agreed they are a true record and can be signed.

230. Matters Arising from the Meeting held on 28th June 2022

- a. Adoption of the road to the sewage farm. The Chair is still trying to contacted Michelle Gundogan. A meeting is being set up with Welsh Water and landowners to discuss the matter. **Action:** Clerk

- to contact WW to get an invite to the meeting and there is a need to keep the CC in the loop as they are not being kept informed.
- b. Dog Waste Bin. DCC are not prepared to pay for one. **Action:** Clerk to ask if they would empty one if the CC bought one.
 - c. River Ceidiog Retaining Wall. Councillor D Robinson has had a response from DCC saying nothing is being done at the moment. **Action:** Councillor Robinson to take the matter forward with Councillor Alan Hughes.
 - d. Rights of Way. Nothing has been done regarding the schedule drawn up. **Action:** Clerk to chase up DCC to see when any action is going to be taken.
 - e. Flood Plain. DCC have responded that they were not asked to comment on the planning application **Action:** Clerk to chase up NRW for a response
 - f. Planning Breach Enquiry **Action:** Clerk to chase up DCC for a response regarding the planning issue.
 - g. Grants. It was agreed to work out a plan of action as regards applying for grants. **Action: All Councillors** to let the Clerk know of any projects that grants could be applied for before our September meeting. A list of priorities can be made at that meeting and the appropriate grants applied for.
 - h. Letter To DCC Education. A response has been sent to DCC stating that the Council is not happy with their previous response.
 - i. Gates on School Field. **Action:** Councillor Robinson to chase up.

231. Annual Report

The Chair read out the Annual Report, which will be circulated to all Councillors and put onto the website.

232. Finance Issues

- a. The RFO gave an update on the banking situation and financial tasks outstanding,
- b. The RFO presented the Schedule of Payments for June 2022 and it was agreed to accept them, including all the payments.
- c. The Annual return was agreed and signed by the Chair.
- d. It was noted that the new goal posts have been ordered at a cost of £1,015.20, including VAT.
- e. **Action:** Clerk to produce a mid-year budget for the September meeting.

233. Planning Matters - nothing to discuss this month.

234. Proposed Gaerwen Windfarm Application

The Chair gave a resume about the recent meeting with RWE, a copy of which has been circulated to Councillors. It was confirmed that RWE will be attending our September meeting and that a public meeting will be held in the Ganolfan in October, to which the AM and MP will be invited. It was reiterated that when planning permission was granted for the Tyfos wind turbine that the CC decided to object to any further applications.

235. Cemetery issues

Councillor Bryn Roberts is pricing up for the cost of repairs required in the cemetery. **Action:** Clerk to ask DCC whether they can provide a black bin for the cemetery. In addition, Clerk to contact the Bishop regarding asset stripping in the village.

236. Education in the Community

237. Old School Project

Rebecca Williams, DCC, is asking for comments on the email that was circulated last month. **Action:** The Steering Group will report back to the CC who will then respond to her. It was noted that the CC will have to arrange for their own legal representation and fund it.

- It was agreed to look at grants to fund the work that is required in the Churchyard
- Green Communities Grant – £30,000 is available to apply for
- Eisteddfod. It was agreed for the Chair to take part in the parade in Bala.

239. Items brought to the Council's attention by Councillors

- Councillor Robinson has received an email from a member of the community who hasn't got any water at home so has been syphoning water out of the taps at the public conveniences in the

village. She was asked to stop doing this as the public conveniences are on a water meter and the bill is paid for by the committee. She has been asked not to do it again. Councillors are asked to be observant in case it happens again.

- b. Benches on the Wern need replacing **Action:** Chair to see if the Green Communities Grant could fund them or whether members of the community would like to contribute to purchasing some.
- c. Back roads are still bad near Tyfos
- d. Speeding on Pennant Road, Llandrillo is a concern as there are no pavements and there are a lot of young families and elderly persons walking along that road. There is nowhere safe for them to go if cars come, and it is especially dangerous when those vehicles are coming at speed. **Action:** Clerk to contact DCC to see if further 30 mph signs can be erected.
